

# DOWNLOADING APPS ON MAC VS IPHONE

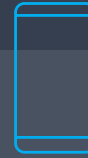
App store gatekeepers deny you the ability to choose how you download apps onto your mobile devices, claiming concerns about security. But these gatekeepers don't show the same concerns when you access apps on your computer:

**Visit an app store or a developer's website**



**Search for an app and begin to download**

You may get a security pop up to verify you trust the source and want to download



**Pay the app developer directly when you make purchases in the app**

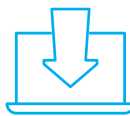


**Need help? Need a refund?**

Contact the app developer directly



**Visit the Apple App Store, the only place to get an app on the iPhone**



**Search for an app and begin to download**

- No guarantee it's the correct one from a trusted source (i.e., scam apps)
- See Apple's apps first. If you search for "music," Apple Music will come up first because Apple self-preferences



**Pay Apple when you make purchases in the app**

- Pay the 30% App tax to Apple
- See a better deal online? Sorry, Apple prevents developers from contacting you, their customer, through their own app or offering you a lower online rate



**Need help? Need a refund?**

Sorry, app stores prevent developers from communicating directly with their customers.

## Why the difference?

The reality is app store gatekeepers are abusing their market power by forcing consumers to only download apps through their app stores and use their payment service, which reduces choice and inflates prices.
